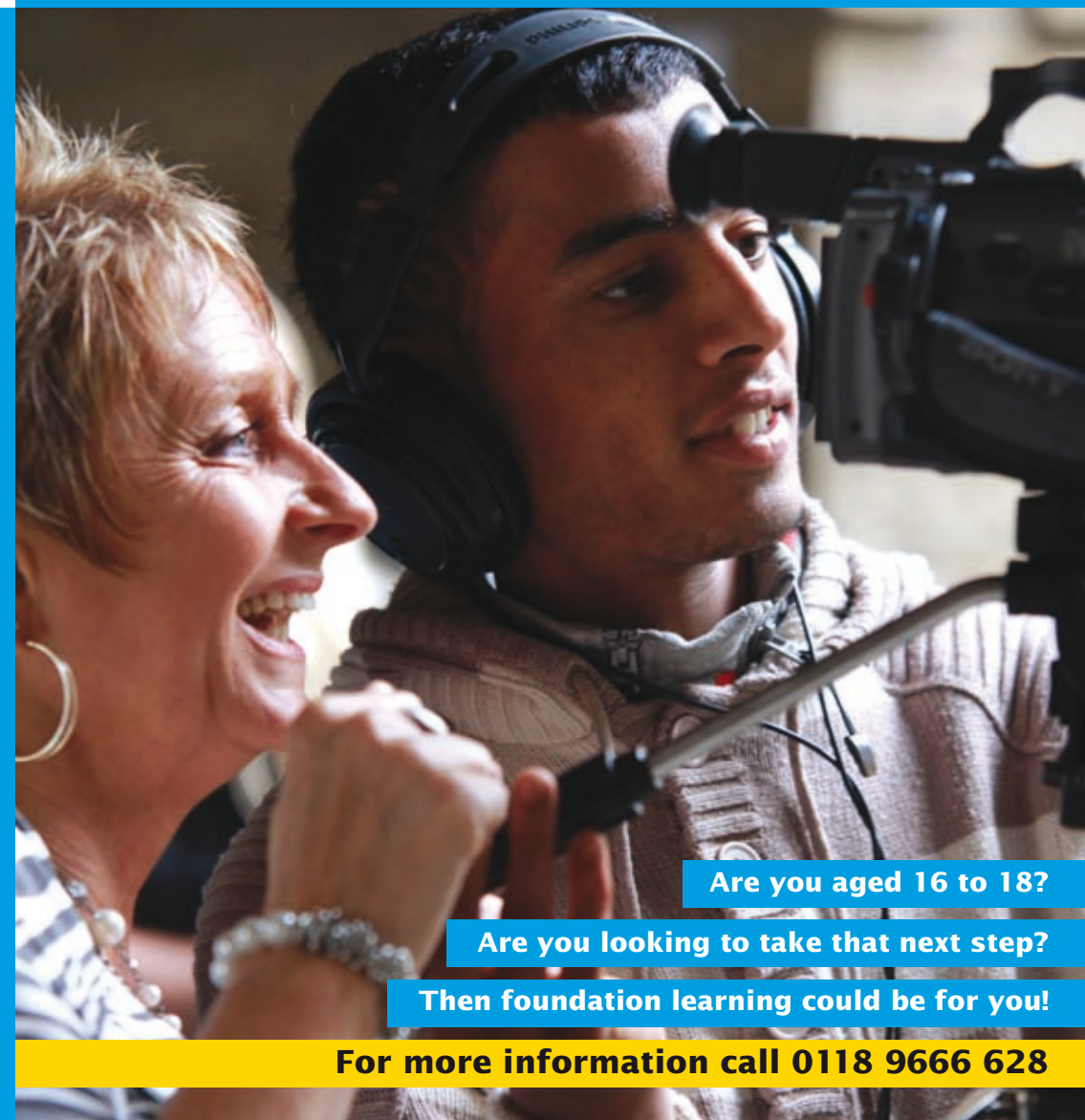
Your future starts here

- preparation for public services
- personal and social development

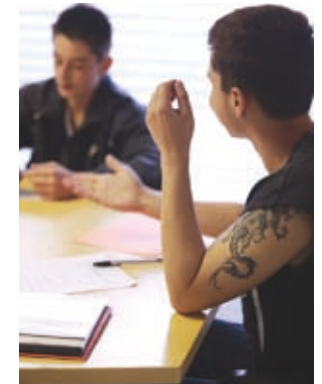
