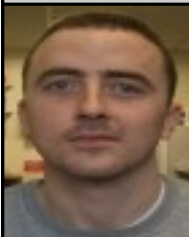

what is the YIP?

Young people who take part in the YIP programme are identified through a multi-agency approach as being 'at risk' of entering the criminal justice system, antisocial behaviour or social exclusion. Our partners include:

We work on achieving specific objectives regarding engaging young people, delivering interventions, reducing arrest rates and ensuring access to education, training and employment .

The project is delivered by Nacro – the national crime reduction charity. Funding comes from the Youth Justice Board.

what do we do?

We offer a programme of diversionary activities within the L4 area covering parts of Clubmoor, County, Anfield & Kirkdale for young people aged 8 – 16 years. The sessions are run outside of school hours, including school holidays, weekends and evenings. We also provide support in schools at home and panel/review meetings.

We give young people a safe place to go where they can learn new skills and achieve certification such as City & Guilds or NOCN through our alternative education programme. They can take part in activities ranging from football and fishing to film/pamper nights. We also provide the opportunity to take part in residential activities.

The YIP is unique as we target 50 young people who are most 'at risk' of becoming involved in the criminal justice system – our ID50. We work with partners to identify these young people and welcome input and referrals from other organisations.

The YIP's steering group is made up of all of the key partners and brings together a host of resources and a range of organisations. We welcome interest from potential partners who can help us deliver the best project possible.

We aim to deliver an exciting range of activities and interventions for young people and believe working with partners can make delivery more effective. We aim to ensure that together with our partners we pool our resources when possible to achieve the best outcomes.
