Bill Perrie retired from HM Prison Service in 1987 after 32 years of working in prisons, including HMPs Hull, Long Lartin and Winson Green.

A renowned practitioner, Bill contributed much to the development of hostels, working-out schemes and regimes for long term prisoners.

Sadly Bill died on 15th November 1997. He was considered one of the pre-eminent Governors of his era.

Throughout his career he was ever aware of the essential humanity of his staff and charges.

In 1986 he attended the first Lectures, named after him. He continued to support them right up 1997.

His inspiration and support are greatly missed.

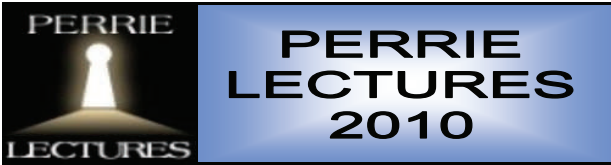
